Riverwood Elementary 3rd Grader, Parker Henderson

In December of 2021, Parker had what was thought of as a seasonal virus. Her doctor ran all the tests – negative flu, strep, covid etc., but noted that her tonsils were swollen and diagnosed her with tonsillitis. After 10 days of antibiotics, there was no improvement and the lymph nodes on her neck looked as though they were trying to swell. January 9th in an ER room at OU Children’s Hospital is a day that forever changed the families life, as they were told what they thought was a case of tonsillitis was actually cancer.

The next day Parker was diagnosed with Pre-B Cell Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia (ALL). The treatment plan for this type of leukemia consists of two and a half years of treatment with a combination of IV, Oral and Intrathecal chemo medications. Parker’s strong faith and incredible support system around her has helped Parker weather this storm and continue to fight every day. Parker will be on chemo every day until March of 2024.

Prairie View Elementary’s Sheila Ransom, The Ransom Family

Sheila Ransom is a teacher at Prairie View Elementary in Mustang. Her coworkers describe her as amazing, extraordinary and a servant at heart. However, the Ransom's lives were changed when her husband, Troy, was diagnosed with terminal cancer. To fight the cancer and prolong his life, Troy began immunotherapy treatments. These treatments are not covered by insurance, and the Ransom’s are having to pay out of pocket. This financial burden comes as Troy is also undergoing radiation treatments and other medical care.



Mustang Public Schools Operations Department, Xiomara Andrade

Described by her coworkers as always happy to help and never without a smile, Xiomara Andrade was diagnosed with a chronic kidney disease that has resulted in multiple kidney transplants already in her life. She often has to travel for more affordable medical treatments, and is currently in need of a new kidney. Despite this challenge, she continues to work and spread kindness throughout the various schools by pitching in wherever she is needed.

The Cavett Kids Foundation

Since 1997, The Cavett Kids Foundation has provided FREE camps, programs and special events for children battling chronic and life-threatening illnesses (many who are alumni of Mustang schools). Their mission is to develop character, coping and connection for kids battling life-threatening illnesses. Today, they are now an established non-profit with over 20 years of service and an impact reaching nearly 15,000 children each year. They offer seven camps, four ongoing programs and annual events at no cost! The camps and programs provide traditional childhood fun like fishing, arts, crafts, swimming and a camp dance. So many of the campers cannot attend a traditional summer camp because there is often nobody qualified to care for them. But at Cavett Kids, they provide a fully staffed volunteer medical team. The camps are truly more than just a camp...they are a place “where illness does not define the child.”
