The Cavett Kids Foundation



Since 1997, The Cavett Kids Foundation has provided FREE camps, programs and special events for children battling chronic and life-threatening illnesses (many who are alumni of Mustang schools). Their mission is to develop character, coping and connection for kids battling life-threatening illnesses. Today, they are now an established non-profit with over 20 years of service and an impact reaching nearly 15,000 children each year. They offer seven camps, four ongoing programs and annual events at no cost! The camps and programs provide traditional childhood fun like fishing, arts, crafts, swimming and a camp dance. So many of the campers cannot attend a traditional summer camp because there is often nobody qualified to care for them. But at Cavett Kids, they provide a fully staffed volunteer medical team. The camps are truly more than just a camp...they are a place "where illness does not define the child."
